

4 Killed In Crash

BONN. West Germany (UPI) — Two captains and two sergeants died in the crash of a CH54 helicopter at Sembach air base near Kaiser-slautern, the Air Force said.

The Air Force identified the victims as:

Capt. John G. Piroutek, first pilot, 31 years old, married, from Milesville, S.D.

Capt. William M. McGeorge, instructor pilot, 35 years old, married, from Jamestown, N.Y.

Sgt. Ronald G. Bridges, flight mechanic, 23 years old, unmarried, from Cairo, Ill.

Sgt. Richard D. Seaman, flight mechanic, 23 years old, unmarried, from Du Quoin, Ill.

An Air Force spokesman said the four men had been making a routine training

flight around the Sembach base

The aircraft had landed on a helipad on the base, then lifted off to an altitude of about 10 feet when it suddenly fell to the ground and burst into flames.

"The crewmen were killed instantly," the Air Force said.
